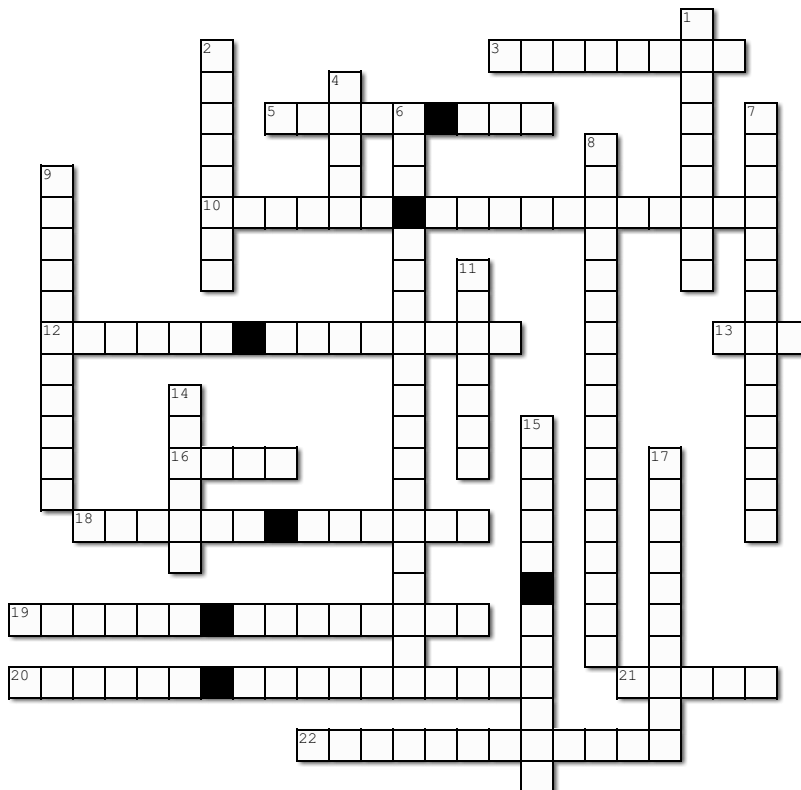

- 3. A person whose sexual orientation may involve people of different gender identities.
- 5. A transgender person assigned female sex at birth, but whose gender identity is male.
- 10. A person's capacity for profound emotional, affectional and sexual attraction to, and intimate and sexual relations with, individuals of a different gender or the same gender, or more than one gender
- 12. The assumption or belief that everyone is either a woman or a man.
- 13. A person whose gender identity is male, whose sexual orientation is toward other people whose gender identity is male. May also be used as an umbrella term to refer to all homosexual people regardless of their gender identity.
- 16. A person who is not part of a sexual or gender minority, but who consistently acts in solidarity.
- 18. A group of people who are emotionally close and consider each other 'family' even though they are not biologically or legally related
- 19. Each person's deeply felt internal and individual experience of gender, which may or may not correspond with the sex assigned at birth.
- 20. A person's ways of communicating culturally-defined traits of masculinity or femininity (or both, or neither, or another gender).
- 21. A slur, predominantly against gay men. Also a reclaimed term increasingly used as an umbrella term for people of all kinds of sexual and gender diversity, and sometimes used to imply a more radical political perspective.
- 22. A person whose sexual orientation is toward people of the opposite gender identity as themselves (assuming binary gender norms).

- 1. A third gender group within Samoan society, that may or may not also identify as transgender.
- 2. A person born with physical sex characteristics (including genitals, gonads or chromosome patterns) that do not align with medical and social norms for female or male bodies.
- 4. Transgender and third gender people within Indonesian society (note: transpan may be preferred).
- 6. Genetic, hormonal and anatomical characteristics of bodies, configurations of which are used for stereotypical categorisation of bodies as male and female.
- 7. The assumption or belief that everyone's gender identity is always consistent with their sex assigned at birth and the organisation of the world on that basis.
- 8. The assumption or belief that everyone is or should be heterosexual and the organisation of the world on that basis.
- 9. A person who identifies themselves in a different gender than that assigned to them at birth.
- 11. A person whose gender identity is female, whose sexual orientation is toward other people whose gender identity is also female.
- 14. Someone in Fiji who identifies as masculine and a woman.
- 15. A person who has a gender identity that is neither female or male.
- 17. A person whose sexual orientation is toward people of the same gender identity as themselves.
